Re: Resolution #122 Authorizing the Submission of a City of Columbia Social Service Funding

Request for Independ Living Program.

Executive Summary

Approval of the proposed resolution would authorize the CHA Director of Human Services to submit a grant application for the City of Columbia Social Services Funds to fund an additional Independent Living Coordinator by expanding the program, to serve HCV Households.

Discussion

The Independent Living Program exists to help CHA residents – who are elderly and/or have disabilities – to live independently as long possible and to prevent premature and unnecessary institutionalization. CHA provides affordable housing for a large population of residents with disabilities, elderly tenants, and near-elderly renters at Oak Towers, Paquin Tower, and CHA Family Sites.

The goal of the Independent Living Program is "to create partnerships provide collaborative supportive services to assist public housing residents who are elderly and/or have disabilities to live independently as long possible and to prevent premature and unnecessary institutionalization."

The Independent Living Service Coordinators are social service staff who were hired initially to develop and enhance the effectiveness of links among supportive services deemed necessary for independent living and elderly public housing residents, as well as those with disabilities. The coordinator arranges a broad spectrum of services for residents, which includes, but is not limited to:

- Educating residents and housing management staff on elderly and disabled service coordination
- Providing formal case management
- Assessing individual service needs
- Helping determine eligibility for public services
- Linking residents with needed supportive services in the general community
- Monitoring the provision of services
- Acting as an advocate for CHA's residents in dealing with community service providers

...to prevent premature and unnecessary institutionalization and to enable residents to stay in their public housing community as long as possible.



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This additional funding would allow CHALIS to expand the Independent Living Program into Housing Choice Voucher Households.

Suggested Commission Action

Approve Resolution 122 to authorize the submission of a City of Columbia Social Services Grant Application to expand the Independent Living Program, to serve HCV Households, and authorize the execution of the contract award agreements and implementation.

WHEREAS, the Housing Authority of the City of Columbia, Missouri believes that services promoting family self-sufficiency and independent living are very important in assisting to public housing households working to care for themselves, and

WHEREAS, some of the most vulnerable public housing residents include children, and residents who need to gain job skills and financial literacy, to work toward self-sufficiency, and

WHEREAS, CHA Low-Income Services, Inc. was formed to help develop additional community resources to help youth succeed, families work toward self-sufficiency, and the elderly and persons with disabilities live as independently as possible.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Directors of CHA Low-Income Services, Inc. adopts Resolution 122 authorizing the submittal of social services funding applications to the City of Columbia, Missouri for CY2022 to support the Independent Living Services Program.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that if the applications should be approved, this Resolution authorizes the execution of the Contract Award Agreements and implementation of each community support program as described in the social services funding applications.
