Re: 2023 CHALIS Amended Budget for Calendar Year January 1, 2023 – December 31, 2023

Executive Summary

The proposed amendment to the 2023 CHALIS Budget for Fiscal Year January 1, 2023-December 31, 2023, presented here reflects changes since the original budget was approved.

Discussion

The major changes are as follows:

Revenues:

- 21st Century ESSER III and CPS ESSER Revenue and expenditures for these carry-over grants from 2022 have been updated based on the actual financial results of the 2022 calendar year.
- MAP County Development the award amount received was \$9,750 less than the requested amount.
- HHC grant revenue has decreased due to changes in the County billing method and rate/unit for this program. While our approved agreement is still in the amount of \$185,648, we do not believe we can reach this billing amount in 2023 and plan to negotiate a reduction.

Revenues (continued):



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- Veterans United the amount awarded for 2023 is \$10,000 less than anticipated.
- The Housing Ambassador grant has been added back in the amount of \$12,025. This amount was
 remaining of the original 2021-2022 grant when our Housing Ambassador transferred to a different
 position in November 2022. In March, CHA received a grant extension from the City to use these funds
 through 12/31/2023. CHA is therefore proposing to add back this part-time position paid through
 these City funds.

Expenditures:

- Moving Ahead Program CHA staff is proposing to add a position to provide the training originally budgeted as Contracted Services with outside organizations and to assist in achieving our goals for the various programs that comprise this program.
- The County funding policy allows 15% of salaries and payroll taxes to be covered for indirect costs related to their programs. For the County MAP and HHC programs, the amended budget moves the indirect costs that exceed this amount to the City and other local funding sources. Indirect costs include paid time off, insurance and other employee benefits, and administrative costs.
- HHC One position has been removed from this program starting in April 2023 to compensate for the reduction in anticipated revenue.
- City Housing Ambassador grant We are proposing to add back this part-time position paid through these City funds.
- The cost of the CHALIS accountant was reduced to ½ year because the position has not been filled yet.
- Contracted Services decreased by \$30,871 based on moving costs for the proposed MAP employee to the salaries and benefits area.
- Program supplies additional reductions in the salaries/ benefits area allowed an increase of \$47,892 to support various events and activities.

Total impact: \$22,882 reduction in 2023 estimated CHALIS funding as follows:

- Federal funds increased by \$112,127 (CPS ESSER funding \$105,504 was originally presented as Local grant funding but it is Federal ESSER funds)
- City grant funding increased by \$12,025 based on the addition of the Ambassador Housing grant
- County grant funding decreased by 73,543
- Local grants decreased by \$66,276 (see note on Federal funds line above)
- Other Income decreased by 7,214 based on reduction of indirect costs that can be reimbursed

Total 2023 estimated CHALIS funding is now \$925,770.
